BURGLARS' BIG JOB AT CAMBUSLANG

The officials of the Savoy Picture House, Cambuslang, discovered yesterday that the picture house, which is situated in Cambuslang Main Street, had been entered by burglars. The thieves entered the building at the rear by climbing up 16 feet of the wall, and were assisted half-way up by an electric bracket. By breaking windows and bursting open doors, they made their way to the office in the front of the building, where they removed the safe to the centre of the room. The uniforms of the officials were then placed round the safe, and the whole was covered with office books before the burglars, by means of explosives, blew off the door of the safe. A sum of £130 in cash was stolen.
