Six Persons Injured

Six persons were injured in an alarming smash in Cambuslang late on Saturday evening, when a Glasgow Corporation trainway car which was Finding on the west-going line in Main Street soldenly started to move backwards, and, gatherar speed on the steep hill, left the lines and Cashed into a stone wall adjoining the Cambusand gas works. The tramear, a newly conditioned vehicle, was Flanding about six o'clock in Main Street oppo-site the Cambuslang Co-operative Society's pre-Third Without warning it began to travel backwards, and gradually gaining speed on the slope, crossed the loop line on to the opposite tramway lines. The conductress, who was standing on the tear platform, tried in vain to keep the trolley wheel on the overhead wire. The driver also remained at the controls and made frantic en-deavours to brake the vehicle. Two of the passengers on the top deck descended and jumped to the street. The car continued to descend the hill at an increasing rate, and finally crashed into a wall at the corner of Clydeford Road, near the gas works. The wall was smashed, and also a wooden fence adjoining, and the rear of the car was badly damaged.

A large crowd soon assembled, and, as the Vehicle was leaning over at a dangerons angle, the police were kept busy preventing anyone ven-

turing near.

Yesterday morning a breakdown squad from the Transport Department, with four motor tehicles, started to remove the obstruction.
